4. Activity Updates and Discussion

Compass Program and Other Preservation and Improvement Activities

- Mille Lacs Compass Program: There will be added outreach during 'Lunch & Learns'
 April, June, and September. Lynn Gallice and Harmony retain program files. Barb
 notes funding for coordinator of Mille Lacs Compass ran-out. John is Compass
 program participant and notes the technical assistance of SWCDs is key. Margaret,
 also a Compass participant, notes communication is needed. Veronica plans to
 review. Mille Lacs SWCD is hiring to replace the Rum River watershed coordinator
 (Harmony).
- Rum River One Watershed, One Plan (Jake, Laurie): Rum River Partnership Policy Committee meets Jan 26. Draft workplan here: https://www.millelacsswcd.org/wp-content/uploads/2019/04/2019.01.29 Rum-1W1P-work-plan-1.7-Final.pdf
 - Work plan allocates \$190,000 for Wahkon storm water BMP projects. If projects are not completed, money may be available for other projects.
 - Jake noted that the Compass Program is our main contribution to the Rum River Watershed Plan. Jake will invite Susan Shaw, Mille Lacs SWCD to discuss how to advance Compass and next steps.
 - Pat attended DNR Roundtable and noted \$35 million additional state funding for the DNR. Suggests we reach out to our Senators and Representatives to support funding. Pat will be attending the Mississippi Watershed Plan meeting. John encourages group to reach out to our legislators. Attachment 2. List of Legislators
 - Ann introduced diver clean-up of lake bottom and study of ecological effects of garbage/plastics in the lake. Ann will email additional information.

- John noted that discrete projects need outline of required resources, outcomes expected, and plan to achieve and how they fit with our priorities. Then communicate to Rum River Watershed for review and approval.
- AIS grant 2023 (Janet): Provide Janet with dollars needed, e.g., website and SEO support, Healthy Land Healthy Lake Expo fall, 2023, CD3 unit support, assist with Lunch & Learn budget. Must be related to AIS. We have sufficient marketing trinkets to include line towels.
- Get the Lead Out Tackle Exchange (John): John has supply of nontoxic tackle. Ann notes 300 pieces of lead-free tackle will go out with Keep It Clean messaging on the '23 DNR Creel Survey.
- "Keep it Clean" Campaign (Ann): New website up https://keepitcleanmn.org/ with info for new members. 12 lakes have now joined the effort. 25 Mille Lacs businesses have KIC banners up. MASWCD passed the Keep It Clean resolution, so now becomes part of legislative platform for 88 MN SWCDs. Geofencing educational ad is running; ad in 2023 DNR Fishing Reg Handbook pending. Discussing year round dump stations with MPCA. County Attorneys need to support DNR tickets for garbage violations.
